On the next page, you'll notice a set of flash cards. Print 'em and cut 'em out. Not required but VERY useful.

## **EXERCISE 1**

Draw a card & find that note on the E string AND the A string.

## **EXERCISE 2**

Same as above, but set a metronome to 60bpm. Give yourself 4 clicks to find each note. You can speed up the metronome to increase the challenge, or reduce the number of clicks... like give yourself 2 clicks instead of 4.


#### **EXERCISE 3**

Do the same as above, but instead of simply playing the note, apply the power chord shape (ring finger is 2 frets higher, on the next string)

#### **BONUS CHALLENGE!**

Do the same as above, but instead of the power chord shape, do a full barre chord shape. This challenge is reserved for those who are familiar with the major and minor barre chords, rooted on the E and A strings. Let me know if you want more barre-chord related challenges.

For your reference, here are all the notes on the E-string and A-string. Use these to check your answers, but try not to rely on them.
